Into Ag

'Into Ag' is a pilot four-day program designed especially for young people who are new to farming, or who want to see if a career in farming is for them. It has been designed as a link between school and a career or further education in the agricultural industries.

The pilot program will be held in Cleve, from Tuesday 14th to Friday 17th March (inclusive). It will lead young people interested in farming through a series of hands-on introductory training on livestock handling, machinery maintenance, GPS, work health and safety, and on-farm communication. Training will be delivered by local Cleve specialists, together with AgInnovate consultants, brining a mix of practicality and the latest theory to the sessions.

Is it for me?

Into Ag is for everyone who is:

Home on the farm for a gap-year Keen to see what working in agriculture is like Keen to work on a farm, but doesn't have a family farm to work on

Bosses who want to upskill their young people in the latest

Not only will you get a chance to learn and experience the latest in the agricultural industry, but you will also get a chance to form social networks with peers and meet local farmers looking for staff.

What's included?

All accommodation and day-time meals are provided for the students. Students are asked to purchase two evening meals (night one and three).

What's expected of you?

This will be your workplace for the week. So as a young farmer (18-25yo) all we ask is:

- You participate with enthusiasm, with a smile on your face and a happy attitude
- You arrive at sessions on-time and dressed in neat and tidy workwear (long pants, protective footwear, and a broad brim hat)
- You treat everyone with the respect that you deserve (we all come from different backgrounds and with different experiences)
- You do not come to any sessions (including dinner) under the influence of alcohol or drugs. You will be asked to sign a declaration to state this. If you break this rule, you will be asked to leave the course immediately.
- That you support other members of the team to achieve their goals for the week.

How's its come about

Our farm businesses are large and operate highly technical machinery and we need our farm team members to be respectful, honest, safety conscious and efficient on farms.

Through this introductory program, opportunities for farmhand training in modern farming techniques and development will be offered to those who desire to work in our rural and agronomical fields.

We know that we can no longer rely on 'farmer kids' to fill our workforce shortages. This course – 'Into Ag' will bridge the gap and provide hands-on training in the Country. We hope that this program will encourage people to Cleve, and that they will realise the joy of living and working in our rural communities.

We hope this program will attract enthusiastic people onto the Eyre Peninsula. We want to introduce them to a 'mateship working environment' where the hours fade away while they are enjoying the many facets of farming.

Very few young adults experience the rising and setting of the sun. They are oblivious to the importance of the changing of the seasons. Although, the work is at times demanding with harvest, shearing, and seeding etc., for those who can experience the wholesome and natural way of life, it could be what breaks the back of the urban rural divide.

This program will give young adults exposure to farming, and outline to them the positive farm careers available in our industry. Who knows where this training will take them? On a journey that they could previously only dreamed of

Into Ag - The Program

The course will provide hands on training modules to cover all the necessary skills of livestock management, basic machinery maintenance, safe chemical use, work health and safety, on-farm leadership, and communication. It will provide participants with a 'jump-start' into a career on-farm. It will give them the basic skills to get them 'Into Ag'.

It will take the lessons out of the classroom and onto the farm where practical skills are taught by farmers and local small business operators. Students' will receive a certificate of attendance. The skills learned will give young people the tools to springboard into an agriculture career. It will be suitable for those from farming families, but new to farming; those already with on-farm roles; or those who want to learn more about farming to see if it is a career they'd like.

The program is based on Hay Inc model Rural Education program, in New South Wales. Hay Inc was established to address the declining numbers of young people living in the country areas and to support young people to stay and enter our agriculture dependent community.

The program is a start, and will provide mentoring, knowledge, support, networking, and opportunities to for young people to be engaged in the agriculture.


