SA Regional Review update

The South Australian Tourism Commission has reviewed the current model of regional tourism organisation structures and operations across the state.

An initial briefing on the report was provided by SATC last week to the Regional Tourism Organisation Chairs and Regional Managers to share the key take-outs and to outline the next steps.

The review investigated opportunities for increased strategic and operational alignment between and across regional tourism organisations, industry stakeholders, and state and local government, as well as opportunities in resourcing, management, marketing, product development and industry capability building.

It outlined five possible business models, with a recommendation that the preferred options be investigated further. After consultation with key stakeholders, including the 12 Regional Tourism Organisations, the SATC will prepare a business and financial case as part of the next steps.

SATC Recreational Fishing Tourism Strategy

Have your say on our Recreational Fishing Tourism Strategy, to help SATC understand how to grow the tourism sector currently worth \$380 million a year to South Australia's visitor economy.

Around 810,000 leisure visitors to and within South Australia include fishing as part of their trip - making it an important driver of visitation across the state, and an opportunity for South Australia to be a key recreational fishing tourism destination.

Tourism Australia Reconciliation Action Plan - Stretch

Tourism Australia fourth Reconciliation Action Plan outlines Tourism Australia's vision for Reconciliation as one where the cultures and knowledge of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and communities are embraced as central to Australia's identity; and that all Australians feel proud of connecting with 60,000 years of storytelling, resilience and innovation.
